My knowledge of Mr. Adam Rosenbloom as a conductor is based on a review of his videotape. I was impressed by his rehearsal, his command of Italian, and the way he conducted. In both the rehearsal and the performance he was not working with top-level players, so I think it is to his credit that he had control of the situation and a command of the score.
